I got an eagle twice in Frisbee golf. That's in the bin with two throws.

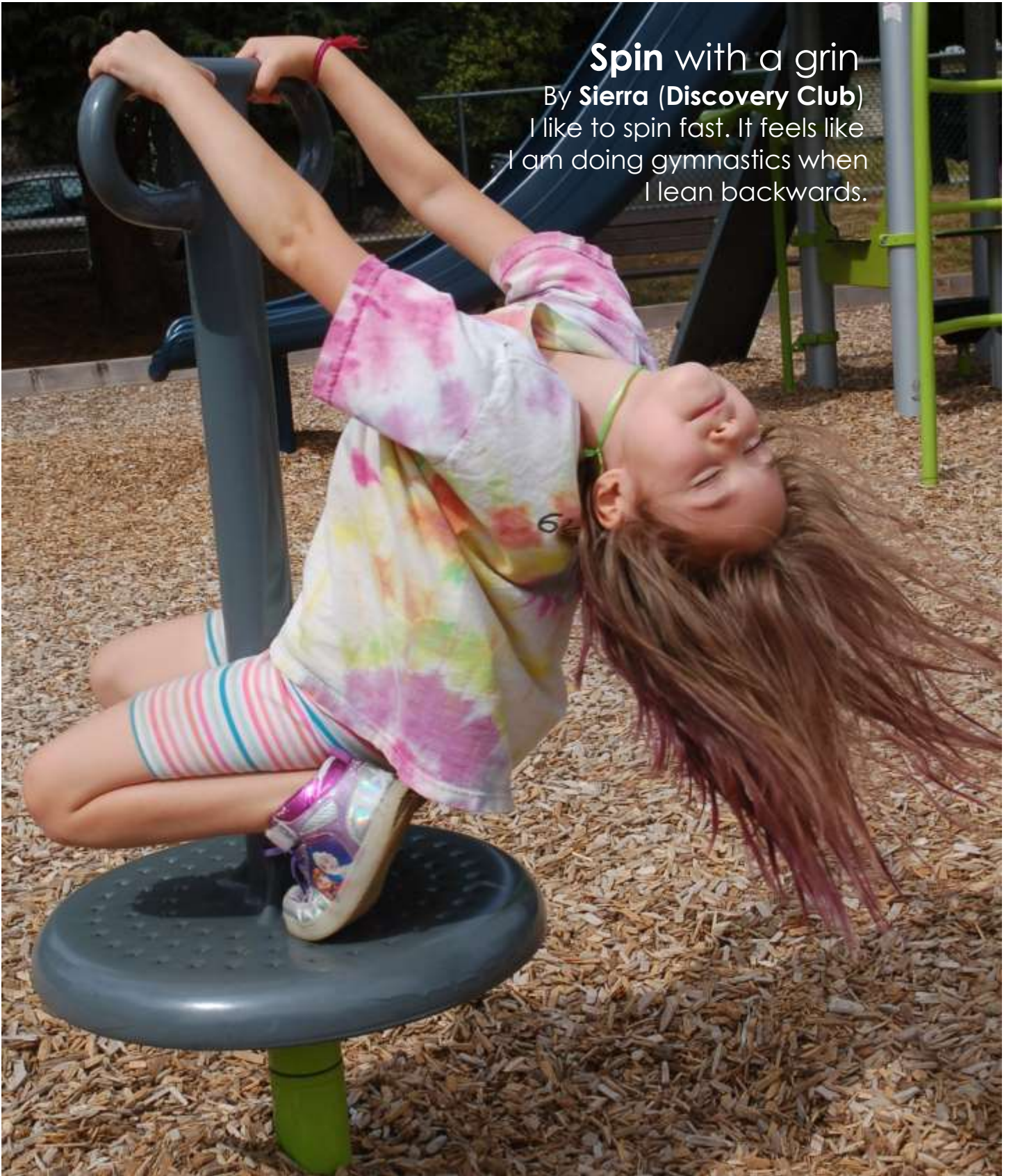
